#### The Epiphany of the Lord

On 5 Jan, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany, the biblical event where the Magi, also called the Three Wise Men or Three Kings, travelled from the East to pay homage to the newborn King, Jesus Christ. The Magi's coming to Jerusalem acknowledges the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. They sought the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations.



The Magi bring with them gold, incense and myrrh. The offer of gold is to proclaim Christ's Kingship, incense is to adore His Godhead, and myrrh is to acknowledge His mortality.

Let us also come in humble adoration to worship our newborn King. Hallelujah!

## Jubilee Year 2025 – Pilgrims of Hope



#### Description of Jubilee Logo

The logo for Jubilee Year 2025 shows four united embracing figures representing the four corners of the earth. At the front is the Cross, the sign of faith and the source of hope. Under the four figures are waves symbolising the difficult challenges we encounter. Below the Cross is an anchor, a symbol of hope. Hope steadies us when life is rocky and uncertain.

#### Jubilee 2025

In 2025, the Church celebrates the Jubilee Year of Hope. The theme **"Pilgrims of Hope"**, was inspired by <u>Romans 5:5</u> – *"Hope does not disappoint"*. In his papal bull announcing the Jubilee, Pope Francis shares his hopes that the Jubilee will *"be a moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the "door" (cf. <u>In 10:7.9</u>) of our salvation, whom the Church is charged to proclaim always, everywhere and to all as "our hope" (<u>1 Tim 1:1</u>)."* 

# Our 180<sup>th</sup> Anniversary (2026) Series – "St Joseph: Model of All Who Work" Article 2

#### Tough early environment

Missions Étrangères de Paris (MEP) and St Joseph's Church in Kranji and Bukit Timah (SJCBT) faced many challenges in their early history in Singapore.

MEP evangelised in an era of the Protestant Dutch, the Anglican British and regional Catholic missions. When MEP claimed jurisdiction to represent the Catholic Church in Singapore in 1832, the Portuguese Mission objected. A Spanish priest from Goa also claimed jurisdiction. The Portuguese and the French Catholic missions argued their cases for a few years through newspaper letters until a papal decree reconfirmed that the MEP Apostolate Vicar of Siam had jurisdiction over Singapore. The Portuguese Mission then started St Joseph's Church in Victoria St in 1853.

Mission life was always tough for our parish founder Fr Anatole Mauduit. Chinese secret societies, losing revenue from memberships, opium, prostitution and gambling when workers became Catholics, killed a Chinese Christian and burnt his plantation in 1849. When Fr Mauduit was in Paris seeking medical treatment in 1851, anti-Catholic riots started in many parts of the island with secret societies pillaging Chinese Christian plantations and killing many Catholics. Fr Marie-Francois Issaly, who managed the parish in Fr Mauduit's absence, escaped the riots when he attended to a sick woman elsewhere and safely returned to town by boat.

Fr Mauduit's health suffered from rural hardships over the years. He often sacrificed his own meagre rice portion for his poor parishioners. When he vomited several times on Wednesday of Holy Week in 1858, Fr Jean-Marie Beurel from the MEP Mission gave him the Last Rites. Fr Mauduit died on Holy Thursday 1 April 1858 at the age of 41. He was buried in SJCBT on Good Friday.

Chinese migrants in the jungle always lived in fear of snakes and tigers. Fr Augustin Perie once killed a cobra with his gun and a huge python with both his gun and a stick! With tigers killing people almost daily, the Chief of Police wanted to use a dead coolie as bait to capture a tiger, whose skin was worth one hundred dollars, but Fr Perie defied the order and had parishioners bring the corpse to the church for a funeral vigil. In 1862, Fr Perie also faced threats from the secret societies, who tried to poison him and placed a \$1000 reward for anyone who killed him! When typhoid fever hit around 1862 and the infected Fr Perie could not get more medical assistance to treat parishioners, his Portuguese friend working in The Singapore Gazette wrote an article on 'The plague at Bukit Timah'. This resulted in the Governor sending doctors and medical supplies to stop the disease.

The harsh conditions in the 19<sup>th</sup> century also affected the health of the few MEP priests who were overstretched. Fr Beurel, who was deeply involved in the churches and schools, including the dispute with the Portuguese Mission, had a stroke in 1868 and died in Paris in 1872 at the age of 59. Fr Marie-Francois Issaly assisted Fr Beurel to manage the Chinese Christians; was Chaplain at the General Hospital; supported Fr Mauduit between 1847-1853; was parish priest of SJCBT over two terms while also looking after the Aukang parish; helped Fr Pierre Paris to build the Church of Saints Peter & Paul in 1870; and died aged 51 while seeking medical treatment in Hong Kong in 1874. Fr Pierre Paris looked after parishes in Bukit Timah and Aukang; served prisoners in the Bras Basah jail, which had beriberi outbreaks; and died in Singapore in 1883 at the age of 61.

Fr Jean-Marie Belliot faced various problems in his 60 years as a missionary. In 1888, he survived four gunshots to his chest and knife wounds to his limbs when he confronted ten thieves in his parish house. Known as the 'Sharpshooter Priest', he once sent a message to a gangland leader not to mess with him by shooting down a coconut from a tree with a single gunshot! His health declined from 1917 and he died in 1934 aged 86.

By God's grace and St Joseph's protection, our parish survived the tough early environment.




